




NEWS FROM THE REGIMENTAL FAMILY

HISTORICAL NOTES

The Origins of 7 Tor's Newsletter Take Post

It was 1994 when the Commanding Officer LCol Don MacGillivray approached me, asking if I'd be interested in creating and being editor of a newsletter for 7 Toronto Regiment, RCA. I thought the idea was excellent, and I whole heartedly accepted the task. Producing *Take Post* became my secondary duty at 7 Tor, my primary being that of Forward Observer Officer (FOO) in the firing battery. I had only months earlier transferred in as an artillery Captain from 30 Fd Regt RCA, Ottawa. My civilian full time job was that of Intelligence Officer with the Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS). CSIS had just posted me from Ottawa to Toronto for field operations, and so I switched from 30 to 7. Before moving to Toronto, I worked at CSIS Ottawa head-quarters in the Research Analysis and Production (RAP) branch as a writer of threat assessments and intelligence reports. Furthermore, in

addition to my past duties at 30 Fd as a FOO, my secondary

duty there was that of creator and editor of the 30 Fd newsletter *The ByTown Gunner*, so I was comfortable taking on the job as editor of 7 Tor's newest endeavour, and *Take Post* was incepted.



Take Post was designed to broadly communicate subjects of interest and concern to soldiers and friends of 7 Tor. It was also intended the newsletter have a lighter side, as it was an ideal place to publish amusing anecdotes, photos or comics. All soldiers and friends of 7 Tor were encouraged to contribute to Take Post. The six page newsletter was published bi-weekly. Take Post had unique features which included a parade schedule sized to fit easily in one's wallet, with little scissors bordering the schedule to encourage soldiers to cut it out. I'd go to a local printer and have hundreds of copies made. I'd then assemble the newsletter on my kitchen table. It cost about \$35 an issue. Take Post was then distributed to all soldiers and friends of the regiment. You

can see how the design of *Take Post* was similar to that of *The ByTown Gunner*, and 56 Fd Regt RCA's *Regimental Briefing Note* (RBN). To save time, I just copied what worked.

When my twins were born, I left CSIS for a safer more family oriented career in finance, joining Edward Jones Investments, and establishing my practice in Niagara-on-the-Lake and transferred to 56 Fd Regt RCA where I produced their newsletter as well.

Almost 30 years later *Take Post* continues to this day. Currently HLCol Jeannette Chau is editor. The newsletter has evolved with the times and is now distributed

electronically. It is a delight to see it still in circulation after so many years have passed. LCol (Ret'd) MacGillivray's great idea is still alive and well, bringing artillery news updates regularly to the Gunner community. May *Take Post* continue to inform and entertain for another 30 years. Ubique!





LAST POST

John McKenna passed away on July 7, 2020 He was a former Commanding Officer of the 7th Toronto Regiment, as well as our former Honorary LCol and HCol, among many other achievements.

Colonel (Ret'd) John Mckenna has held senior positions in both the private sector and in the Reserve Forces of Canada. Over the period spanning 32 years he held a variety of key management positions in large multinational companies specializing in environmental process and industrial controls. Concurrent with his civilian career, John McKenna served as a reservist in the Canadian Army (Militia). He joined the 29th Field Regiment in 1957 which was reformed in 1965 as the 7th Toronto Regiment. He worked his way up to the position of Commanding Officer which he held from 1969 to 1972. He was elected National President of the Royal Canadian Artillery Association (1974). He was elected Vice-Chairman (Ontario) for the Conference of Defence Associations in 1986 and 1987, and served as the Chairman for 1989-1998. In July 1990, he became the Vice-President for Canada and Head of Delegation for the Inter-allied Confederation of Reserve Officers (CIOR) and relinquished that position in 1993, He was appointed as Honorary Lieutenant Colonel, 7th Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery (M) and held that position from 1989 to 1992 and was the Honorary Colonel from 1991 to 1999. He is a Board Member and trustee for the Toronto Artillery Foundation. He is a Vice-President and Director of the NATO Association of Canada. He writes on military matters and has been published in the Canadian Defence Policy Review, the Royal Canadian Canadian Military Institute and the NATO Association of Canada's publications. He has been awarded the Canadian Forces Decoration with two clasps, the 1967 Canadian Confederation Centennial Medal, the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal and the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal.

The NATO Association of Canada mourns the death of Colonel John McKenna. Colonel McKenna was an active and vital member of the NATO Association (formerly the Atlantic Council of Canada) for many years. His humour and "can-do" attitude were invaluable to our organization. In addition to serving as a Vice-President and Director of the NATO Association, he led many of our NATO tours to Brussels as a way of engaging Canadian thoughtleaders. Throughout his life, Col. McKenna held senior positions in both the private sector and in the Reserve Forces of Canada. Over a period spanning 32 years he held a variety of key management positions in large multinational companies specializing in environmental process and industrial controls. Concurrent with his civilian career, John McKenna served as a reservist in the Canadian Army (Militia). In 1957 he joined the Royal Canadian Artillery (Militia). He was elected National President of the Royal Canadian Artillery Association (1974). He was elected Vice-Chairman (Ontario) for the Conference of Defence Associations in 1986 and 1987, and served as the Chairman for 1989-1998. In July 1990, he became the Vice-President for Canada and Head of Delegation for the Inter-allied Confederation of Reserve Officers (CIOR) and relinquished that position in 1993, He was appointed as Honorary Lieutenant Colonel, 7th Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery (M) and held that position from 1989 to 1992 and was the Honorary Colonel from 1991 to 1999. He was a Board Member and trustee for the Toronto Artillery Foundation. Colonel McKenna wrote on military matters and has been published in the Canadian Defence Policy Review, the Royal Canadian Military Institute and the NATO Association of Canada's publications. He was awarded the Canadian Forces Decoration with two clasps, the 1967 Canadian Confederation Centennial Medal, the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal and the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal. He was always present at Association functions with his dear wife, Helen, and added warmth and grace to all of our events. He will be missed
